I also work in reception and I enjoy meeting our customers and helping them. I have been one of the Printer Reps on the Print Centre Management Committee for two years.

In the Print Room our dynamic and motivated team of Printers and Staff produce a full range of items for our customers, including magazines, business and personalised stationery, calendars and reports. Printers are trained to use the digital copiers, photocopiers and our high volume/low cost printing machine.

Printers also use print finishing equipment such as the laminators, booklet maker, electric and manual guillotine and staplers, creasing and folding equipment. Printers work to agreed targets to meet their accredited training programme.

In our Design Room we provide a professional design service, with our Printers assisting with products such as personalised and promotional goods such as T-shirts, mugs and bags.

Printers also gain transferable skills to meet the challenges of day to day life, such as numeracy and literacy skills and work preparation. The Print Centre works with a person centred approach which helps to develop advocacy skills. Printers are involved in all aspects of running the Print Centre.
